Human Rights Claim Form Form T1

Use this form if your claim is that your human rights in terms of the Human Rights Act 1998 have been infringed:

- (a) by one or more of the Intelligence Services or any person acting on their behalf in any circumstances, or
- (b) by any of: Her Majesty's Armed Forces, any police force, the National Criminal Intelligence Service, the National Crime Squad, or the Commissioners of Customs and Excise in circumstances which involved (or which currently involve):

- (i) interception of your communications by post or your telecommunications.
- (ii) surveillance which has resulted, or is likely to result, in private information about you being obtained.
- (iii) surveillance concerning you which has been, or is being, carried out in relation to anything taking place on any residential premises or in any private vehicle.
- (iv) covert human intelligence which has been, or is being, used in relation to you, e.g. the use of a personal relationship for the purpose of getting information about you without you knowing about it.
- (v) any entry on or interference with property or interference with wireless telegraphy.

If your claim relates to the infringement of your human rights by any other organisation or in other circumstances you should take the matter up with the organisation concerned.

2. The Tribunal has power in appropriate cases to award compensation, to quash or cancel any warrant or authorisation, to order destruction of records and to make such other order as they think fit.
